SUMMARY:

A. OVERVIEW

The governor of Florida, Rick Scott, has declared that a state of emergency exist in every county in the State of Florida due to Hurricane Irma.

B. PRESCRIPTION REFILLS

Pharmacists can dispense up to a 30-day emergency prescription refill of maintenance medication to persons who reside in an area or county covered under this Executive Order and to emergency personnel who have been activated by their state and local agency but who do not reside in an area or county covered by this Executive Order.

C. EXPIRATION OF EXECUTIVE ORDER

The requirements of this Executive Order will expire 30 days from the date of this Executive Order, unless extended in increments of no more than 30 days by the agency, and in no event will remain in effect beyond the earlier of the date of the expiration of those Order, as extended, or 90 days from the date of issuance of this Order.
